The Lord make His face shine upon you...

In seminary, one of the first words that I learned in Greek class was "prosopon." I suppose it will always be a word in my repertoire for that reason. By the way, it means face. I came across that word once again when I was reading Paul's second letter to the church in Corinth.

In the 4th chapter Paul writes: "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6 ESV.)

So what's the big deal about "face?" Like many words, it has many connotations. There is the obvious meaning, "the front part of the head from forehead to chin." Then there is this meaning, "the expression/countenance shown by its features." The word also could be used as a verb. As a verb, face means, "to have or turn the face toward (a certain direction)."

So, when the Lord makes His face shine on you it's a good thing. "The LORD make His face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD turn His face toward you and give you peace" (Numbers 6:25 NIV.)

It is to bless you that the LORD causes you to be in the direction of His gaze.

To behold the face of Christ is the ultimate of blessings. John, the apostle/ evangelist writes: "They will see His face, and His name will be on their foreheads. And night will be no more. They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever" (Revelation 22:4-5 ESV.)

To behold the face of Jesus Christ is heaven. It's the goal of our faith!

You may be tempted to think, "Do I really want our LORD to gaze upon me, a sinner? Do I want Him to see my every action, hear my every thought or the words that roll so easily off my tongue?"

God gives us these frightful words which Moses penned: "Then My anger will be kindled against them in that day, and I will forsake them and hide My face from them, and they will be devoured. And many evils and troubles will come upon them, so that they will say in that day, 'Have not these evils come upon us because our God is not among us?' And I will surely hide My face in that day because of all the evil that they have done, because they have turned to other gods" (Deuteronomy 31:17-18 ESV.)

How often have we given our LORD reason to turn His face from us! How often, in full view of His face, have we willfully and shamefully done things as if in secret, as if no one was looking!

One more Biblical reference to the word face makes all the difference for you and me. Luke writes: "When the days drew near for Him to be taken up, He set His face to go to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51 ESV). The King James Version says it like this: "And it came to pass, when the time was come that He should be received up, He steadfastly set His face to go to Jerusalem."

In other words, Jesus willfully went to the city of His execution. There He openly suffered at the hands of sinful men, suffered the tortures of the damned in hell and died the sinners' death...all in full view of His Father's face! Because of what Jesus allowed to happen to Himself and for what He willingly did (kept the Law of God perfectly in our place) our LORD's face is always set toward us in blessing. For His face always gazes upon us through the cross of Jesus Christ.

What a difference it makes that our LORD's face is resolutely and steadfastly set upon us! In Jesus, our Father in heaven has answered our plea for mercy. He orders all things for our eternal good. Not one thing escapes His protective gaze upon the objects of His affection, namely you and me.

If you should ever have doubts that His face is really upon you for your eternal salvation, just gaze upon the face of Jesus Christ and you don't have to wonder anymore.

God is up to something good!



When it comes to stewardship, a favorite Bible verse is the account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1–4). It's a moving account. Our Lord praises the seemingly small gift of two copper coins given by a poor widow above the abundance of gifts given by the rich, saying, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them" (Luke 21:3).

And that is usually where we stop. But the text goes on. "For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:4).

"She ... put in all she had to live on." She gave everything. She held nothing back. She trusted that the Lord who made her and all creatures, who gave her everything she had, who redeemed her from her own sin, from death, and the power of the devil, who called her by the Gospel and enlightened her with His gifts of Word and Sacrament, would continue to do this. He would provide her with all that she needed for this body and life because that is the character of the God she had.

But this is not why we give small gifts. Her gift, though it appeared small, was actually large. When we are tempted to give small gifts it is precisely because we want them to be small! We don't trust the Lord to provide for us.

We give small gifts because we lack faith in the One who created us, redeemed us, sanctifies and keeps us in the one true faith. We give small gifts because we doubt that God will really give us what we need and desire. We give small gifts because we are not content with what God has already given.

We are not slaves, children of the slave woman, under the Old Covenant (Gal. 4). We are adopted sons of the free woman. And since we are sons, we are also heirs. And heirs receive the inheritance. For everything is already ours in Christ. And thus, moved by the willing spirit of adoption, we do the will of God in financial matters far beyond all that done by those under the Old Covenant who were forced by legal demands.

So what have you decided to give? How do I decide what to give? Let the Scriptures be your guide.

We are to give proportionally to what we have received from God's giving to us (Luke 12:48; 1 Cor. 16:1-2, 2 Cor. 8:12). But you have not been set free to give nothing. See that you excel in the grace of giving (2 Cor. 8:7).

We are not free to live selfishly outside the Gospel, without regard for God who gives us all good gifts, without generosity for our neighbor who needs us and our gifts, without supporting the community of faith in which we live, without care for our spiritual fathers and those who teach and help raise our children in the faith, without resources for the poor and needy – in short, we are not free to live unto ourselves, hoarding what God has given us only for us.

For love is the fulfillment of the law (Romans 13:10). And the sum of the law is this: Love God and love your neighbor (Matt. 22:34-.40). We love because He first loved us. We give because He has given to us.

Luther once said, "Possessions belong in your hands, not in your heart" (LW 14:240). There is a reason your 10 fingers spread apart. With your hands you catch God's gifts for what you need and let the rest fall through your fingers to your neighbors – your family, your friends, your community, your church.

Harvest time!

With harvest underway or imminent, fields of ripe grain, tall cornstalks and soybeans turning brown recall Jesus' words to the disciples: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:37-38, ESV).

Nowadays farmers use fewer laborers and bigger machines than in decades past. But what about harvests of faith? Leading people to know God's love can't be done "mechanically." Studies show that newspaper ads or door-hangers left anonymously are less effective at bringing people to church than a warm personal invite.

Right after urging his disciples to pray for harvest workers — in a classic instance of "You might be God's answer to your own prayer!" — Jesus sends them out as those very laborers! How will they work the harvest? Not by guilting people into faith. Not by pronouncing judgment or biblical law. But by using Jesus' authority to counter evil, illness and brokenness among those they befriend.

Ponder and pray about where Jesus is sending you as his laborer to cultivate and reap Christian faith and assurance of God's love. 10
