Christmas Spider

And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

- Matthew 2:12

A few times a year I take out the Shop-Vac and suck up all the spiders and cob webs in the garage. I find it rather cathartic. But, it's inevitable that the next morning there will be new spiders and new webs. Not really sure how that works. This year, as I was digging out the Christmas totes from the basement, I noticed again some spider webs and dust bunnies in those places that never get a good cleaning. These webs though, brought to my attention to this story of the little known Christmas spider (as told by Pastor Allen of Pilgrim Church)...

Among the countless Christmas legends, there is one involving a Christmas spider. According to this legend, when Joseph was warned in a dream to flee from King Herod and the massacre which he intended to inflict upon the children of Bethlehem, several animals from the manger decided to accompany the Holy Family on their journey. Each of the animals was determined to protect the baby Jesus, and each felt sure his or her particular talents would prove invaluable in that task.

There also happened to be a spider who wanted to come. Yet none of the other animals felt the spider would be helpful. After all, she was only an insect. She had no keen ears or sharp teeth, no strong bones and no claws whatsoever. However, the spider persistently pleaded to be included, until at last the other animals agreed she could join them, provided she did not get in the way.

Unfortunately, as the journey unfolded, all of the other supposedly brave animals either were frightened off or else were distracted. They ended up returning home or embarking on a more appealing adventure of their own. With Herod's troops on the march, and with the Holy Family growing more and more tired, Joseph and Mary had little choice but to try and hide.

Finding a small and inconspicuous cave, they huddled inside, seeking shelter and rest, with the donkey and the spider their only remaining companions.

Holding Jesus in her arms, Mary gently rocked him to sleep, and, for a while, it appeared everything would be fine. The only immediate problem was the chill in the air. Seeking to be of help in some small way, the spider carefully wove a web over the opening of the cave to try to keep the baby warm.

The spider had just finished her weaving when suddenly voices were heard outside the cave. The soldiers had caught up with the Holy Family, and they were diligently searching the entire area. When they came to the cave where the Holy Family was hidden, both Mary and Joseph held their breath, certain their doom was upon them. Yet the soldiers passed by the cave. One soldier said it was a waste of time to search it, since anyone who had entered the cave would have broken the spider's web over the opening.

Thus it was that the seemingly insignificant spider saved the day; and the legend goes on to say that this is why we hang tinsel on our Christmas trees ... to remind us of the silver strands of the web which the little spider wove ... and to remind us that no act of kindness, no act of courage, no act through which we seek peace with justice is ever wasted.

The legend also reminds me that someone once suggested we need not only remember that Christ is the reason for the season, but also, believe it or not, to keep Herod in Christmas, because Herod, like Pharaoh before him, worships the love of power (enforced by violence) rather than the power of love. And in turn Herod reminds us all that we do not live in an ideal world but one where we often face both the threat and the destructive reality of violence.

For the followers of Jesus, then, to be alive in him—to be alive in the adventure the Christ Child calls us to—is to side with all those who are vulnerable, even as the Christ Child was vulnerable. It is to live in defiance of those who see the vulnerable as expendable. It is to refuse to bow to any and every Herod and to any and every ruthless regime. It is instead to kneel by the manger before the Prince of Peace and then to go out to weave whatever webs we can as we continue to commit ourselves to acting justly, loving tenderly, living kindly, and walking humbly with God.

May you have a blessed Advent season and Christmas (And a joyous New Year!). Let us not lose sight of the little miracles that go on around us as we scramble to bake the cookies, decorate the house, attend all the kids' recitals and enjoy Christmas parties. Take time to reflect on how God can and does amazing things through all His people, both young and old. See you in church! -Pastor

Welcome to the new Church year! I love that we end each calendar year with the start of the Church year, a time of reflection and holy longing. Just as it has for so many years already, the world still groans in expectation of the Savior, Jesus Christ. Indeed, how many of us have thought, "You can come any time now, Lord."

Yet, as long as the Lord tarries, we have work to do. For my part, I have never been so busy *AND* so full of hope as I am right now. Brushfires has been in a transition phase for the past two years and it is becoming clearer what God is leading us to become.

If you have followed this ministry, you know that our mission is to equip Christian leaders to foster sexual integrity, healing, and wholeness in their churches and communities. Over the past few years we have been working in the community and around the country to do just that.

Many of you attended our community film series at the Grand Opera house in 2016-2017. Some of you have also read out original research conducted with Barna Group and released in 2018. You have also followed along as we helped plan and execute two national training events, the Sexual Integrity Leadership Summit in San Antonio (2018) and Atlanta (2019). Most recently, we conducted a pastors' training program on sexuality issues. Our hope is to hold four more of these around Wisconsin in 2020.

As Brushfires works on these issues, more and more leaders, ministries, and everyday folks are coming to us for guidance, teaching, and direction. The work of the Sexual Integrity Leadership Summit is expanding significantly, and yet, there has been no single organization to take over this crucial leadership role. Until now.

Starting in May, I have been working with a small leadership team to plan and begin executing a transition strategy that would place Brushfires at the center of this national sexual integrity community. Our mission so closely aligns with the work and will of this growing movement that other leaders are asking us to take point on developing the community further.

Practically, this means that we will now be running the annual summits and developing year-round in-person and online training for pastors and other leaders. This might also mean that the Brushfires name is dropped in favor of something that more clearly identifies our work and mission.

As these plans develop over the next year, I would like to ask for your continued prayer and support. We encounter a great many obstacles and significant spiritual oppression with everything we do. Your support is more uplifting and encouraging than you can ever know. Thank you.
