Training a Child

Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.

- Proverbs 22:6

September is already gone and now it's on to the months of October/November, with numerous topics that we could address. Obviously, the BIG one is Reformation Day! We could also look at those special observances such as St. Luke, the Evangelist, St. James of Jerusalem, brother of Jesus and martyr, or Simon and Jude, Apostles. We could talk about mid-term reports from our kids. I could talk about October Fest or the kids who will be coming to your door to "Trick or Treat." We have NFL & college football in full swing, MLB playoffs, fall colors, etc. Columbus Day is on the horizon as well as Canada's Day of Thanksgiving...This is only in October! A lot going on! And most of that stuff isn't even on your radar with all the special things you have planned for the month, and November looming in the short distance.

Yet, as our confirmation and Bible Classes are in full swing, it's so important for us to not only remember Proverbs 22:6 (above), but to actively live it: Yes, training our children in God's Word, but also for us adults to hear, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest God's Word!

This topic reminded me of a husband and wife who had to hire a babysitter. Any parent would know that sitters and daycare cost a bundle. We can readily understand why some parents, if they can, bring their little ones to work with them. After all, nobody can replace mother or father for a child.

Of course, there are times when mother and father ought to be replaced. For example, in the Buckhead area of Atlanta, there was a man and woman who actually brought their little one along as they committed armed robberies.

This leads me to wonder, can we reverse the thought from the book of Proverbs? I'm curious. If you train up a child in the way he *shouldn't* go, when he is old, will he still cling to that way? When the Bible says, "the Lord visits the sins of the iniquities of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generation" (see Numbers 14:17-19), it indicates that such might be the case. This is why Good Shepherd continues to strongly encourage parents to be God's influence for spiritual good in the lives of their children.

That's far better than being negative or fashionably neutral authority figures. Think about it. Parents don't strive for neutrality when it comes to encouraging their children to eat a balanced meal or getting proper rest. They don't say, "I'm going to wait until my children are old enough to decide for themselves if they wish to be potty-trained." We don't strive for neutrality when it comes to teaching our children how to cross the street, or avoiding eating things poisonous, or jumping off a house roof.

In their children's relationship with the Savior, parents need to be a positive, powerful force that God has indicated they ought to be.

Therefore, by way of our Lord's death and resurrection, given to us through His Word and Sacraments, we are enabled to train our children in a God-pleasing way, as well as by patience and comfort through these things, may we embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life...and we're blessed to show them what that hope looks like!

I have received a wonderful blessing this fall. Pastor Hayman is leading a great Bible Study on the book of Revelation. I have the opportunity, on Sunday mornings, to pop into all the Sunday school classrooms, answer questions, see who's there, encourage the teachers, equip our children...and sometimes just sit and listen. I am so thankful for this opportunity to engage, encourage and re-fresh, but I also understand that it doesn't end there on Sunday morning. We are not blessed (yet) with a parochial school where our kids get Jesus every day. We do what we can to support our sister church, Trinity, and the school there, but we can do more.

Please pray together at home. Do some sort of family devotions (Portals of Prayer?). Ask your kids, ask my kids, and any kid you see at Good Shepherd what they're learning about at church. Look at the birthday list at the end of this Parish Pulse and call one of our kids on their birthday. We're all responsible for their formation and growth in God's Love. Ask questions. And please, make an effort to attend one of our Bible Studies yourself! Live it! (And you will not depart from it).

Keepin' Busy

LCMS Stewardship Ministry - September 2019

What is a steward? Most people will say a steward is a manager.

That is correct, but it is only half right. A steward is indeed a manager, but he is a manager of what does not belong to him. Someone else is the owner, and the steward manages the owner's property on the owner's behalf.

We are God's stewards. Our stewardship is that God has made us managers of what belongs to Him: "For we brought nothing into this world, and we cannot take anything out of the world" (1 Tim. 6:7) Everything that we have and everything that we are comes from God's fatherly divine goodness and mercy. God is the owner.

This is not only because He created all things; He is also the redeemer. He has redeemed – that is, purchased – and won all things. Therefore, it all belongs to Him. We are simply managers of everything in this world. Like Joseph in Egypt, we are put in charge of managing what belongs to God. What a privilege.

Think about that for a minute. The all-knowing, all-powerful, all-wise God has asked us to manage his possessions on His behalf here on earth.

And by doing this, He invites us to take part in the allocation of His good gifts. He wants us to give our input and advise Him in where His gifts are to be used. What a privilege indeed.

But what a responsibility! "Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required" (Luke 12:48b). We are not the owners. And while He puts us as managers, we are still to do with His property what He wants done with it. That means we need to know what He desires and wills for His property.

How do we know this? How can we know the will and mind of God?

We find the will of God in the Bible. There God tells us what His will is for all of His gifts. He tells us how we are to spend our time and use our talents and treasures. He instructs us in the use of our minds, bodies, and souls.

There is nothing we have that doesn't belong to Him. "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:19–20). God informs us of the big picture, the overarching policy, of how we as His stewards – managers and custodians – are to manage His property.

And that is stewardship. It is simply doing what God wants us to do with what He has given us.

As St. Paul said, "Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness" (Rom. 6:13).

So, let's dive into God's Word, and listen to what He desires from His stewards.

Past, Present and Future

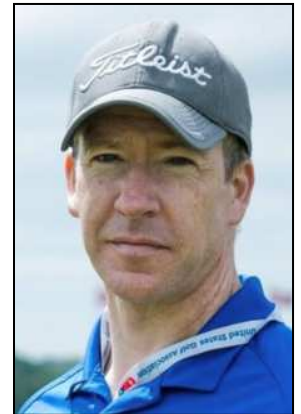

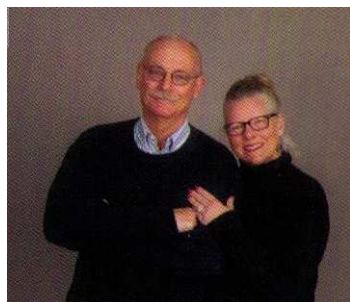
